



The Role of The Rt Revd & Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally, Bishop of London

Bishop Sarah's role is largely defined by given areas of responsibility. She is the Diocesan Bishop of London and Area Bishop for the Two Cities, Dean of His Majesty's Chapels Royal and a member of the House of Lords and Privy Counsellor, Dean of the Province of Canterbury (chairing the Convenors of the Regional Bishops Meetings on behalf of the Archbishops) and a member of the House of Bishops, College of Bishops and the General Synod. She is Chair of Trustees of Christian Aid and a trustee and patron of several charities.

The Bishop of London is the most senior bishop in the Church of England, after the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. Bishop Sarah sits on several committees of the National Church Institutions (the national bodies of the Church of England).

In prioritising the many invitations and opportunities to use her role in the service of Christ, the Bishop seeks to shape her ministry around three key themes:

Hospitality, Wellbeing and Hope.

Bishop Sarah is mindful of her commitment to these three priorities in how she spends her time in the Area, Diocese, wider Church of England and public square. In all that she does, she seeks to witness to the love of Christ, which brings hope and healing.
