## WELCOME TO BIRKDALE







The parish of St John's is based in Birkdale in the North Meols Deanery, Southport.

As you read through our Parish Profile we really hope you will feel a sense of passion to further the mission and ministry of the Gospel within our Birkdale community. We believe that by working with energy, direction, purpose and prayer, we can see the church reaching beyond its walls, making new disciples and seeing God's Kingdom grow in Birkdale. We aim to be a God centred, relationship driven and life transforming presence in our community. Our church particularly feels there is a great need to nurture and reach out in the key area of young adults' ministry. The seeds of this are already being sown at St John's.

The Deanery plan is for 2 posts in Birkdale – an incumbent at St John's and an incumbent at St James' who will also be Priest in Charge at St Peter's. We have made some progress recently in building stronger links with St James' and St Peter's alongside furthering our relationship with Liverpool Road Methodist. This has included lay leadership beginning to build relationships with the intention to have regular meetings to enable us to work better together, support each other and plan for the future. We have also introduced opportunities for joint worship and social events. We would like applicants to be able to build on this positive start and help us develop these links and collaboration further.

### **ABOUT THE PARISH**

#### WHERE ARE WE?

The parish is within walking distance of Birkdale village which is a thriving community with a continental flavour. There are several wine bars, excellent restaurants and a wide range of

independent retailers. Southport is known as 'England's Golf Capital' and has excellent transport links to Liverpool, Manchester and Preston with their cultural heritage.





The parish of St. John's Birkdale is at the southern end of the North Meols Deanery stretching from Birkdale village in the north to Ainsdale village in the south and has a population of approximately 11,000 people. It is predominantly a busy suburban area with some small shops, light industry and farms to the eastern side of the parish. There are very few people in the parish from ethnic minorities. The parish is socially mixed with some pockets of deprivation. There is private and rented accommodation, some housing association homes, some local authority housing and a few pockets of new housing developments. There is a range of good primary and secondary schools in the area.

## OUR CHURCH COMMUNITY

#### WHO ARE WE?

We are an outward looking church with a passion for spreading the gospel. We currently have an electoral roll of 66; 15 live outside the parish. Visitors and newcomers regularly say that we are a friendly and welcoming church family.



#### **ACTIVITIES WE DO**

A fortnightly prayer meeting is held via Zoom which is attended by around 20 people and two Growth Groups - young adults and adults - which meet twice a month.

We have a growing number of young adults joining our congregation and are running activities specifically for them. The children's and young people's groups we have are Rainbows, Brownies and Guides. Our annual Charity Christmas Tree Festival and Christmas Market is a highlight of our calendar; around 25 charities each decorate a tree sponsored by the church.

We also arrange an annual summer fair.

#### **SOCIALS**

We have a reputation for arranging regular and popular social events including themed meals, film nights, concerts and during lockdown arranged several quiz nights and bingo via Zoom. There is a separate programme of social events for young adults.

#### **KEEPING IN TOUCH**

Parishioners are kept up to date with what is happening in the church through the website, Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp group, weekly phone calls to those unable to access the internet and our monthly Parish magazine 'The Word'. Sermons are sent out by email and also recorded to be available on a free phone line and via the website.

#### SUPPORTING OTHERS

We support the Southport Soup Kitchen which provides meals to the homeless and supports families and have links with the local Food Pantry. We also support families referred to us by the Family Wellbeing Centre at the local Primary School with food vouchers and festive hampers. We support CMS, ReVive International and The Children's Society financially each year.

## ABOUT OUR CHURCH

#### Worship and Discipleship

During lockdown we moved away from formal liturgical services and now hold a service of Praise and Prayer at 10.30am every Sunday. This service is also zoomed live from church.

The average weekly attendance is between 50-60 across church and on Zoom. These services are led by the worship team of six people including one retired Vicar with PTO, one Reader with PTO and four people with authority from the PCC. Their ages range from mid-twenties to seventies.

The service includes a mixture of old and new hymns/worship songs, a Bible-based talk and prayers. On the first Sunday each month this service is followed by Holy Communion.

We have a monthly mid-week service of Holy Communion. This is a formal, robed, BCP service followed by refreshments.

Together with St James' we have been holding a monthly, informal time of worship, Sunday@7. This is currently under review.

## BUILDINGS

The church is a Grade II listed building designed by Austin and Paley dating back to 1890.

It is light and airy and provides seating for approximately 350 on chairs and in pews. It has a three-manual pipe organ and a piano. The building is well maintained and has an Audio Visual and loop system installed. The church building is fully accessible, has a children's area at the back and a car park for 30 cars. The grounds are attractive and well maintained. The church is linked by a corridor to the hall which is also very well maintained.

#### THE HALL

Comprises a large hall which can seat 120 people and is fully accessible. It has a stage with an electric screen and sound system. There is a small hall which is carpeted and has a large flat screen TV and piano. There are toilets which are accessible to all. The kitchen is equipped to commercial standards.

#### **MAINTENANCE**

- There is some work required to the brickwork of the west wall (specified in the last quinquennial report).
- Some stone work and glazing to the large west window needs attention within the next five years and repairs could amount to approximately £70,000.
- We have reserves of £77,000.

There is an enclosed children's play area between the church and the hall. Both the church and the hall are cleaned weekly by paid cleaners. The hall is used by the uniformed organisations and a variety of regular hirers including Zumba, bridge group, gardening group, ballroom dancing, U3A group, children's tag rugby and is also available for other bookings such as children's parties. The hall bookings are managed by a hall lettings team.

#### THE VICARAGE

A 1930's detached five bedroom house in an attractive, quiet residential area (17 Kirkstall Road, PR8 4RA) and is within short walking distance of the church. It has three reception rooms, kitchen, garage, outhouse, gas central heating and gardens to the front and rear. The master bedroom has ensuite facilities. It is in a good location for primary and secondary schools.

## OUR CHURCH IN THE COMMUNITY



In recent years one of the highlights in the church calendar has been our Charity Christmas Tree Festival which has been well supported by local schools and individuals. It has brought large numbers of visitors to the church. We also support the Southport Soup Kitchen and the Family Wellbeing Centre. The church hall is used weekly by various groups and private lettings.



Recently there were both infant and adult baptisms, a wedding and a number of funerals in church. Those bereaved during the past five years are invited to an annual memorial service. We also invite the local community to this service and it is publicised on the church website and through social media. We also maintain a Book of Remembrance. Communion is available each month to those who are housebound.



The local primary school, Farnborough Road participates in the Christmas Tree Festival and our last Priest in Charge used to go into the junior school to take assemblies. We have good relationships with the school and have recently restarted links between our congregation and the children.



Within the parish there is one Methodist church and two Roman Catholic Churches. We have good links with the Methodist church and with St James' and St Peter's.

We support Diocesan guidelines for clergy expenses, working practices and holidays and appreciate the need for a recognised day off.
