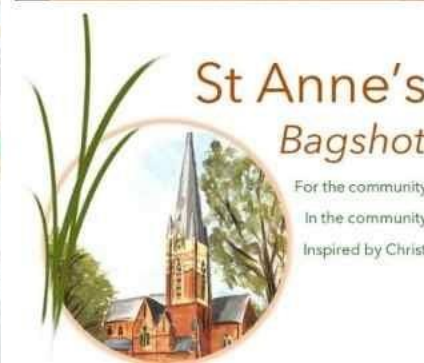
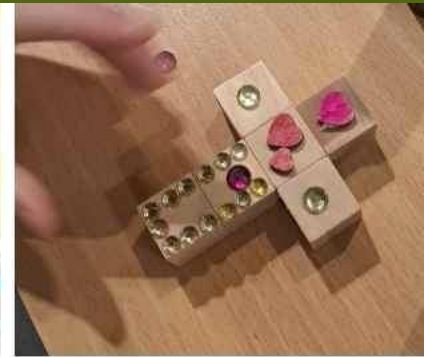

Welcome



Welcome from Bishop Paul

It is a great privilege to live and serve in the Diocese of Guildford. Our part of Surrey and Hampshire (including a parish in London and Sussex) combines the stunning beauty of the North Downs with close proximity to central London. This makes it a highly desirable place to live. It has seen a considerable increase in population in recent years which continues to rise with extensive building of new houses.

We are a very friendly diocese with strong relationships across parishes, schools and chaplaincies. In the last five years, we have invested significantly in clergy wellbeing. We launched the wellbeing covenant in 2021 and, since then, we offer spiritual direction, clergy mentoring and pastoral supervision. We also provide clergy counselling when needed. As bishop, I take the love and care of clergy very seriously.

The Diocese has a strong vision rooted in *Transforming Church, Transforming Lives*. This was the result of considerable consultation in 2015 and was updated in 2023 when we discerned three priorities: *Growing Discipleship, Growing Diversity, and Growing Community*. Each parish is asked to consider what this overarching vision might mean in its local context and express it in a Church Development Plan.

There is significant support of parishes through the central team in Church House Guildford. In 2020, we launched the Parish Needs Process. This is our unique support system which recognizes that each parish in the diocese is different and it seeks to journey alongside each one of them, supporting in a way that is rooted in particular needs - whilst seeking to build a supportive learning community across the diocese.

Building on training provision that has existed for some time in the Diocese of Guildford, in 2026 we launched St Martha's College. This seeks to support our parishes in equipping leaders for all sorts of ministries (including ordained ministry). Its most exciting recent venture has been the two-year *Foundations in Ministry Programme* which has seen over 120 people explore calling and formation.

Whilst we have seen considerable growth in many parts of the diocese over recent years, our greatest challenge since the pandemic has been recovery of ministry to children and young people. We are in the process of prioritizing these areas – as we currently rewrite our children's strategy and have launched the Youth Catalyst Programme which is providing an exciting platform for young people to explore faith.

We are therefore always looking for clergy with a proven ability - or at least the clearest potential - in leading change, fostering a vocational culture and growing the church younger, so that our vision of a *Transforming Church, Transforming Lives* might be more fully realised.

The diocese has been blessed with very able leadership for the last decade through the ministry of Bishop Andrew Watson, whose untimely death in March 2026 caused considerable grief for us as a diocesan family. Inspired by his example, however, we are committed to continue to 'run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith'.

Wishing you every blessing in your discernment – and please do not hesitate to get in touch with one of the archdeacons if we can help in any way.

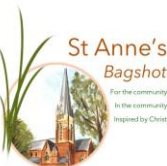
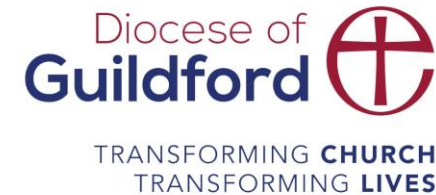
We see ourselves as:

We have a current electoral roll of 99, with around a third living outside the Bagshot parish boundary, drawn by the worship and ethos of St Anne's.

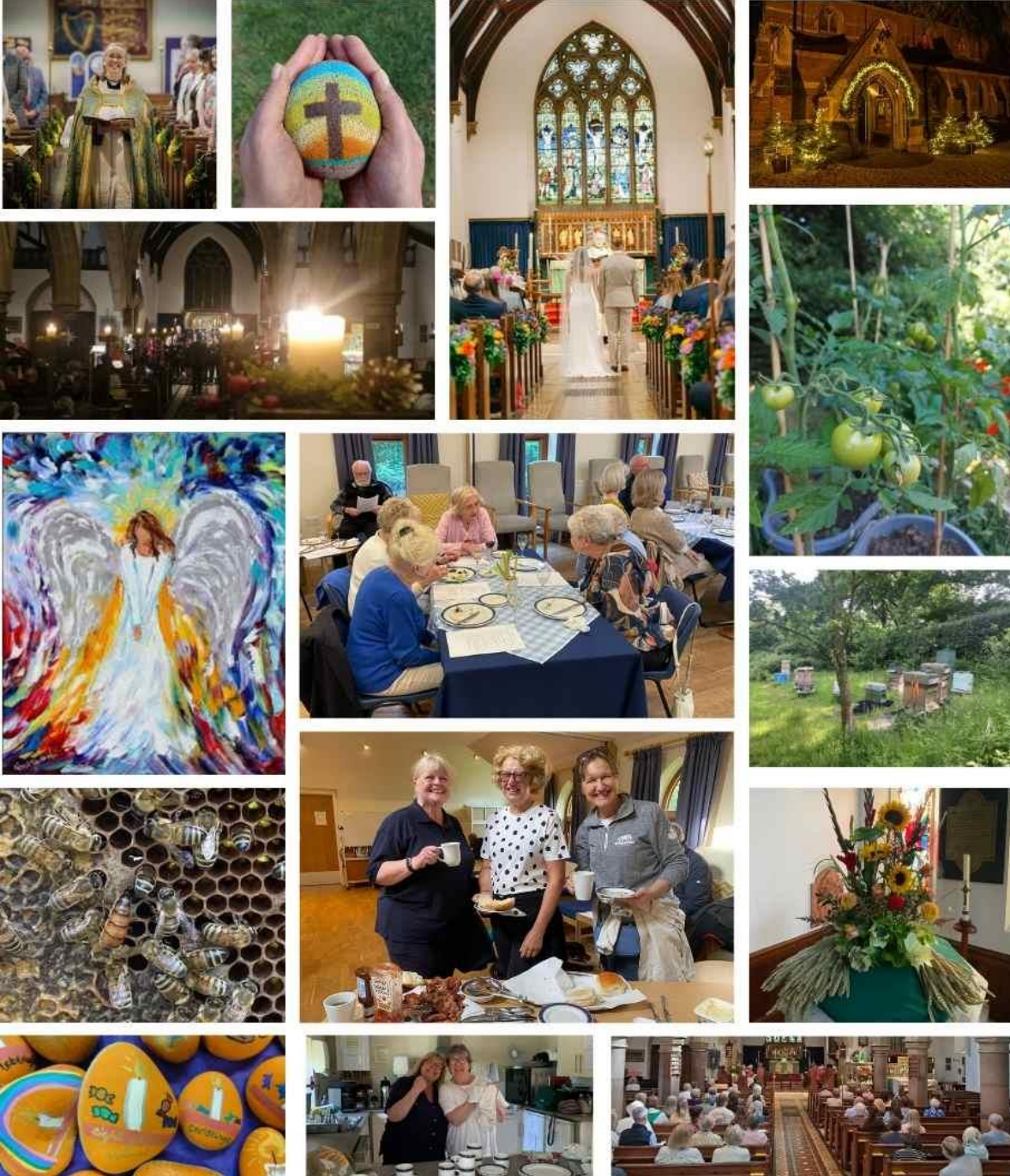
St Anne's has been part of the A Rocha Eco Church awards scheme since 2020 and currently holds a Silver Award. Care for creation is an important part of our church life, led by a dedicated Eco Team working towards Gold status.

We joined the Inclusive Church network three and half years ago; and agreed to offer the Prayers of Love and Faith where this is requested, as the pastoral guidance permits.

An ageing congregation and current volunteer capacity create challenges for long-term sustainability and growth.

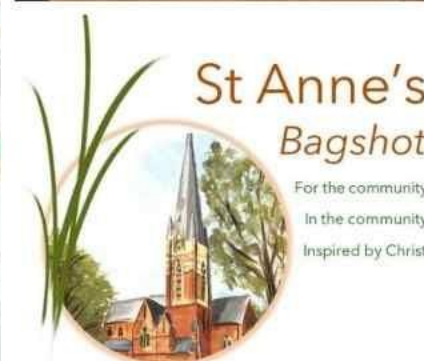
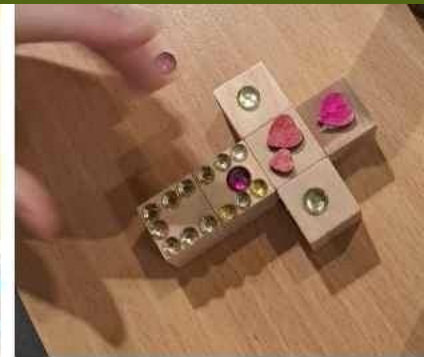
Although income has increased, rising parish share and running costs mean we continue to face financial challenges, and we need to develop new approaches to stewardship and fundraising.

We want to retain our strong Anglican tradition while growing our congregation and engaging more effectively with the wider community, especially families and younger generations.

As a church slightly outside the village centre, we need to continue raising our profile through visible community engagement and events.

Strong leadership, shared vision and clear communication will be essential as we discern the next chapter of St Anne's life and mission.

What is the neighbourhood like?



Our parish

Bagshot is a thriving semi-rural Surrey village within the Church of England Diocese of Guildford, close to the M3, M25, Heathrow, Windsor and Guildford.

Bagshot is surrounded by beautiful Crown Estate woodland, including Swinley Forest, renowned for its walking and mountain biking trails, heathland and wildlife habitats, which extends to Barossa Common on neighbouring, open access MOD land. Together with excellent transport links, this gives the village a unique blend of countryside, accessibility and strong community spirit.

St Anne's stands on a hill above the village, close to the forest, providing a peaceful setting for worship, reflection and community life.

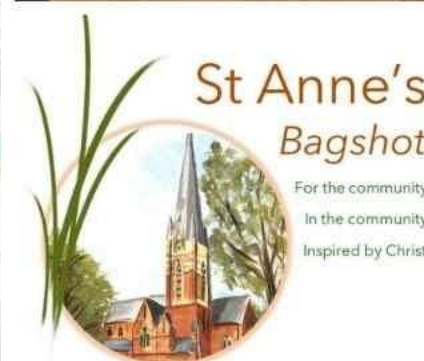
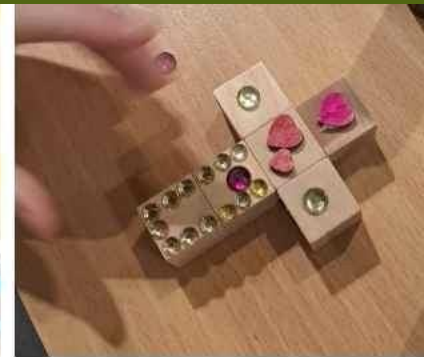
Bagshot has a population of just over 6,000, with a mix of families, professionals and older residents, offering significant opportunities for outreach and pastoral ministry.

Bagshot is well served by local shops, cafés, community organisations, sports clubs and healthcare facilities. The village has an active community life, with many groups using our Church Centre and Parish Hall.

There are excellent local schools, including Bagshot Infant School, Connaught Junior School and Collingwood College, alongside respected nurseries and independent schools nearby.



What is church life like at St Anne's?



Our team

St Anne's is supported by a committed and enthusiastic team, bringing a wide range of experience, skills and perspectives. Together, we are united in our desire to support the mission of the church, valuing our traditions while remaining open to the new.

Our team includes:

- Associate Vicar (SSM) and Area Dean, Revd Ellen Turtle
- Part-time Office Manager, Phillippa
- Churchwardens, Andy and Carolyn
- An active and supportive PCC, made up of 7 elected members and 2 Deanery Synod Reps
- Leaders for safeguarding, comms, eco church, events, fabric, finance, H&S, visiting team and worship planning.

We are blessed with strong volunteer involvement across church life, including bellringing, church cleaning, eco projects, flowers, grass cutting, hospitality, pastoral care, Pixies playgroup and community events. New initiatives such as Faithful Fellas and Youth Alpha reflect our desire to grow and reach new people.

The congregation is highly engaged and willing to support practical projects, fundraising and outreach activities (such as the summer fete and the Bagshot Community Christmas Tree Festival), helping to create a strong culture of teamwork and service.

Our current regular services

We aim for a balanced mix of services throughout the month reflecting different traditions and styles of worship.

While attendance at our weekly 10am service has remained stable, our weekly 8am congregation has more than doubled in recent years (15–22 people weekly) and is growing younger. Our monthly Messy Church has also grown significantly since its launch in 2024, typically seeing 30–40 people come, although special Messy Services have seen much higher numbers. Our monthly Taizé service, though small in number, is a deeply valued space for prayer and reflection.

Alongside our Sunday worship, we offer morning prayer Monday to Saturday, and a Wednesday CW communion service.

Current 10am service pattern (with typical attendance)

First Sunday: All Age Worship (35-55)

Second and fifth Sunday: CW Holy Communion (45-50)

Third Sunday: BCP Mattins (35-45)

Fourth Sunday: Eco themed CW Holy Communion (45-55)

In addition, 15-20 people join the 10am service via YouTube





Seasonal worship & special services

The worshipping life of St Anne's is enriched by a wide range of seasonal and special services that draw both the congregation and wider community together throughout the year.

Highlights include:

- Advent reflections and Lent courses
- Nine Lessons and Carols with an extended choir and a full church
- Community carol singing and an informal carol service at the cemetery chapel
- Christingle and Christmas Eve Crib services (so popular, we have to do two!)
- 'Midnight' Christmas Eve Holy Communion
- Ash Wednesday, Holy Week and Easter Vigil services
- Good Friday Messy Church and ecumenical Walk of Witness
- Harvest Festival and Remembrance Sunday, involving local uniformed organisations
- "Remembered with Love" bereavement service around Candlemas

These services are an important part of village life and often attract many people beyond our regular congregation, creating valuable opportunities for welcome, outreach and invitation.

Life events

There is a growing sense of spiritual openness and opportunity within the parish, with increasing enquiries for God to be a part of key life events.



BAPTISMS

We welcome families as well as teenagers and adults seeking baptism and operate an open baptism policy, supported by preparation and pastoral care. Most baptisms take place as dedicated Sunday services, with volunteers supporting families throughout the process.

CONFIRMATION

We run confirmation classes roughly annually, in response to expressions of interest and usually have 1 or 2 people confirmed each year.

WEDDINGS

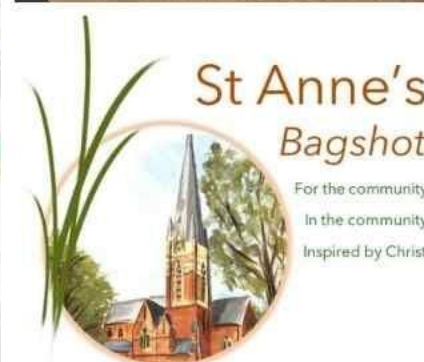
We attract wedding couples from both within and beyond the parish, with some establishing a qualifying connection through regular worship.
We are encouraged that many couples later return for baptisms and ongoing connection with church life.

FUNERALS

Funeral ministry is an important part of our pastoral life, and we have strong relationships with local funeral directors and crematoria. Services are currently taken by the clergy at St Anne's or nearby crematoria, with interment of ashes in local cemeteries.
We continue to support bereaved families beyond the funeral itself, including through our annual "Remembered with Love" service.

Growing God's Kingdom





Mission and discipleship

Our Church Development Plan reflects our vision of being “a blessing to all the community” and has helped shape a growing culture of mission, outreach and discipleship at St Anne’s.



While some plans are on-hold during the vacancy, our active initiatives include:

- Community Christmas Tree Festivals, attracting over 1,500 visitors in 2024 and raising funds for both St Anne’s and local charities – next one planned December 2026
- Faithful Fellas men’s group, launched June 2025
- Fellowship lunches, concerts and community events, restarted 2024
- Growing Messy Church ministry, launched September 2024
- A new Youth Alpha course, started in August 2025
- “Hymns We Love” services, started in January 2026
- Relaunch of St Anne's Fete in July 2026



We are committed to meeting people where they are, both within and beyond the church building. This includes regular worship in local care homes, home communions and developing pastoral outreach within the wider community.



Many of these initiatives are still developing, offering exciting opportunities for our next Vicar to help shape and grow the future mission of St Anne’s.

Youth and children

Growing younger is one of our key priorities and we are keen to further develop our ministry with children, families and young people.

Since 2024, our monthly Messy Church has grown significantly, creating an important point of connection with local families.

Pixies Playgroup, held weekly in the Church Centre, is also a valued part of our ministry, demonstrating the love of Jesus by being there for families and carers.

We have solid relationships with local schools, developed over many years, with clergy regularly leading assemblies and welcoming school visits to the church.

We have also recently launched a Youth Alpha course and are working collaboratively with the Windlesham parish youth worker.

While we currently have a limited provision for older children and teenagers, we see this as a significant opportunity for future growth and mission.



Global mission

St Anne's has a community with a big heart, and we support charities with prayer and resources as we are able.

In recent years, we have supported refugee families from Syria and Afghanistan, and members of our congregation have hosted and continue to support Ukrainian refugees.

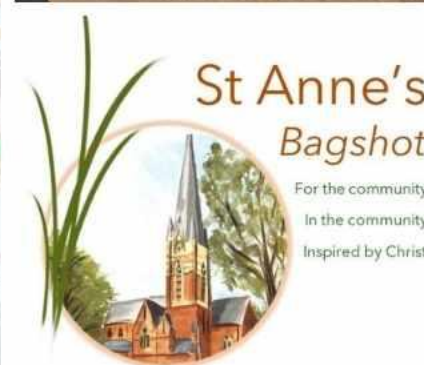
We have a permanent donations box for the Besom food bank, with many of our congregation volunteering there. We also support Connect Counselling Service, set up by local churches three decades ago.

At Christmas we operate a One Card scheme, with donations having supported both the Toilet Twinning scheme, as well as Christian Aid, which we also support through 'Big Brekkie'.

The Christingle service supports The Children's Society. Our other events and concerts also often support charities.

Safeguarding

We believe that every person is made in the image of God, and deserves to be valued, protected and treated with dignity. Safeguarding is embedded in all areas of church life at St Anne's, and we are committed to promoting a culture where the wellbeing, inclusion and protection of children, young people and vulnerable adults is an absolute foundation stone.

Our Parish Safeguarding Officer, Helen, works closely with the clergy, PCC and diocesan safeguarding team to ensure that national and diocesan requirements are fully implemented. Safeguarding training, safer recruitment procedures, DBS checks, and risk assessments are all regularly maintained across the parish.

The parish currently holds Level 3 on the Parish Safeguarding Dashboard.

Our buildings/facilities

St Anne's Church

St Anne's is a beautiful Grade II listed Victorian church, built in 1884. Set on a hill beside Bagshot Park, its spire is a local landmark visible for miles around. The church is open daily for prayer. It seats around 250–300 people, featuring stained glass, Victorian tiling, an eight-bell tower, a fine Walker organ and grand piano. The building is well maintained with significant repairs and modernisation carried out in recent years, including updated lighting and sound systems.

The surrounding grounds include parking, gardens, an allotment and a community-run apiary. There is no graveyard.

The Church Centre

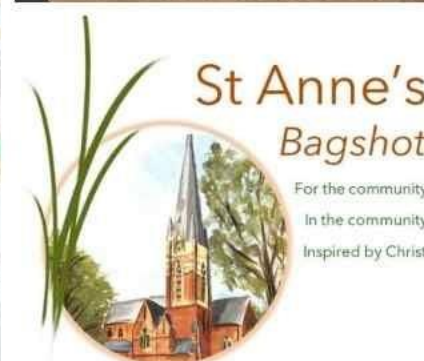
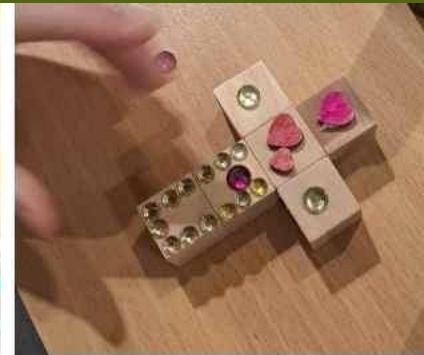
Opened in 2005 behind the church, the centre provides flexible and well-used community space, including the Parish Office, hall (100 sq m), kitchen, and toilets. It supports church activities, outreach work and a wide range of community groups and events.

The Parish Hall

Located closer to the village centre, the Parish Hall continues to serve as an important community facility. Managed by the PCC, it is in good order and used by local organisations and benefits from strong community support.

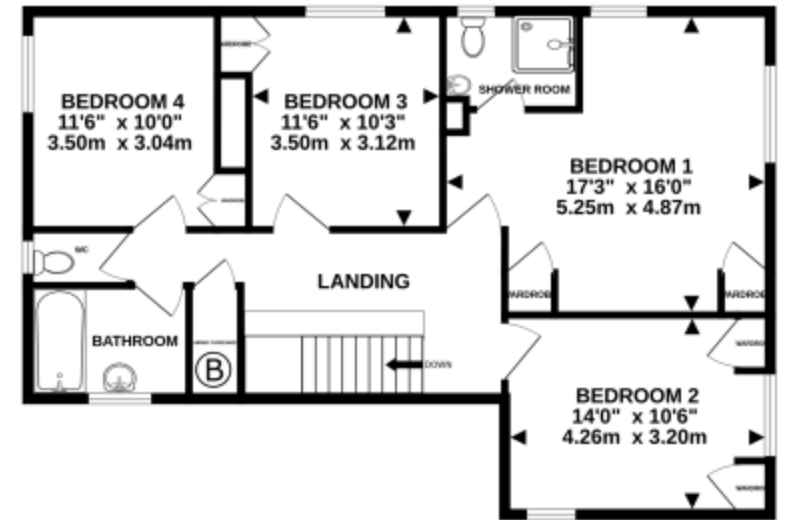
Vicarage

The vicarage, is a comfortable four-bedroom family home, situated next to the church in a peaceful semi-rural setting overlooking Bagshot Park farmland. Built in the 1950s, it offers generous living accommodation, large gardens, a study (with independent access) and an attached garage.

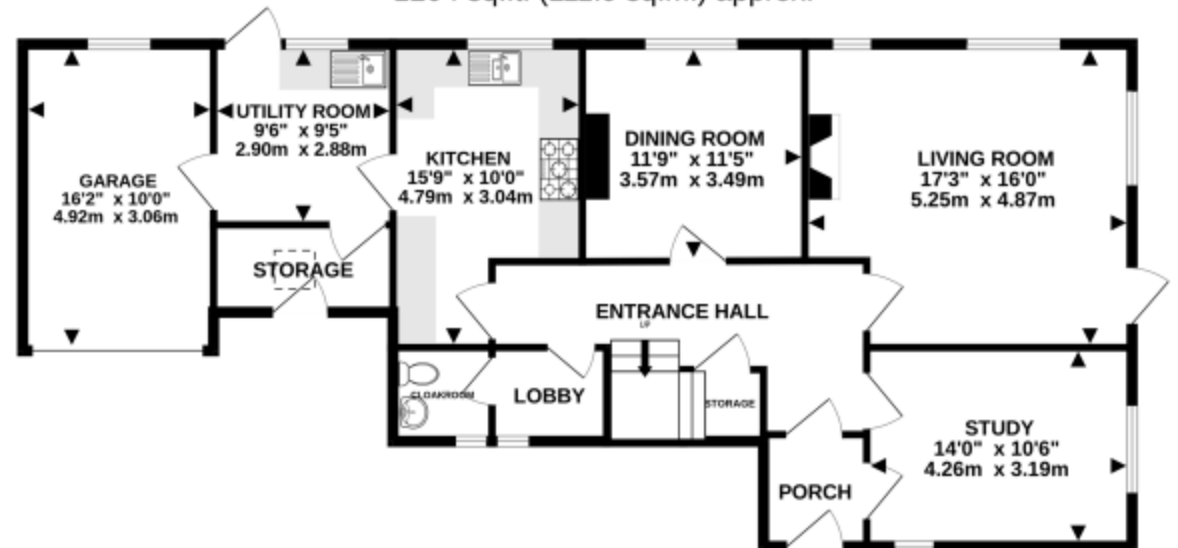
Once an incumbent has been appointed, the PCC will arrange for the vicarage to be redecorated, in consultation with them.



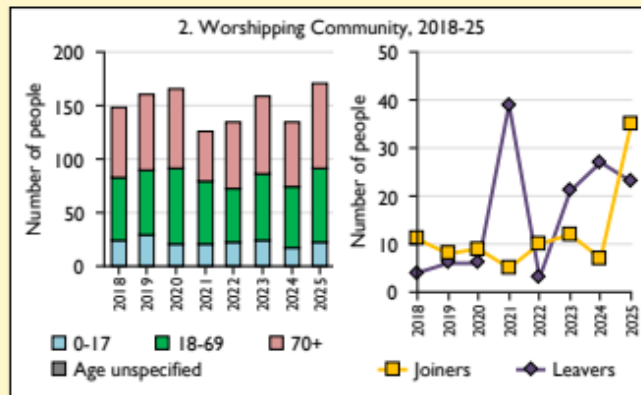
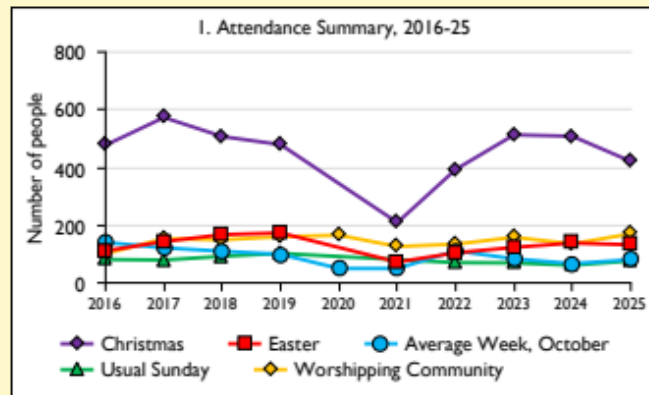
