Worship Community

Our church community is housed in a truly beautiful 140 year old church which is located at the top of a hill looking over the town centre. Though we are a town steeped in industrial heritage, the town and parish has recently seen lots of new housing developments and there is a multimillion pound town centre development starting shortly.

While our parish faces some challenges with a fast growing population and some areas of deprivation, St Mark's strives to continually widen it's reach with a dedicated, hard working family of volunteer mission leaders.



We're a congregation with a strong evangelical history. We're 'middle-Anglican', using common worship to give our services structure. Music is important to us at St Mark's, and our experienced organist leads us in hymns and contemporary songs at morning services. We celebrate communion together once or twice a month depending on clergy availability, and other services tend to be a service of the word. Our size is 30 - 35congregation approximately worshippers on Sunday morning, and like many parishes we are predominantly of middle and retired age.

In the recent past we have hosted Messy Church style services in our Gamble Hall for young families in the area. We'd like to expand our reach towards young families, and would like a leader who can help us in this area. In August 2025 we also began a more relaxed and informal monthly service, with the hope of reaching fringe members of church and those who we connect with through our midweek activities and the Gamble Hall.

Mission & Outreach

Tots and Toddlers

We run a very successful toddler group on Friday mornings at the Gamble Hall. This allows us the chance to get to know local families, who can start to feel part of our community. We invite these families to special events and we would like to do more to bring young families into the worshipping life of the church.

SMASH (St Mark's Activities and Social Hub) This is an opportunity to connect with the community on a weekly basis, and is attended by people of varying ages, some having been signposted to us by other agencies. We provide lunch and also the opportunity to do a variety of arts and crafts, play board games or to just chat. This is a venture which has been running for almost four years and has the potential for further development – perhaps the foundation for another worshipping community as an extension of the existing church.

Social Events

Throughout the year we run a number of events and community activities which are always well attended and supported by the local community, including garden parties, summer fairs, car boot sales and plant sales.

Recently we secured grant funding to offer a 'breakfast with Santa' for the local community at the Gamble Hall which was attended by around 50 children demonstrating the community spirit in the area and the goodwill people have towards the church. We have many ideas about what we can achieve in the future and are firmly committed to finding ways to grow our church community, in formal and informal worship. We seek a Priest who can lead the way and developthe opportunities in our parish.



Our Parish

Our parish consists of residential and industrial properties. It includes Haresfinch Park and Victoria Park, both of which are beautiful assets to the community. The parish is an urban district with a moderate percentage of the population on a low to middle income. The parish is home to approximately 6500 people and 2500 homes. These are a mix of private housing, social housing and sheltered accommodation. This is expected to grow with a large new housing estate being built just behind the church. Our hope is that our church can make the most of this exciting opportunity and reach many new families in the area.

Within the parish there is a URC church and a large Roman Catholic parish, with whom we would like to develop a better relationship. The post-holder will work with our church and the Eccleston Team, and we're looking forward to collaborating with them closely in mission and ministry to better reach St Helens with the good news of Jesus. The town boasts a highly respected industrial history with the Gamble and Pilkington families playing a considerable part. One of our church halls (the Gamble Hall) is named after the Gamble family who famously set up works in 1828. The family gifted the land and paid for the Hall's construction and gifted it to the parish of St Mark's.



Finances

St Mark's is up to date with its parish share (approximately £25,000 per year) and has a good payment record. Our total income last year was approximately £60,000 and our expenditure was £90,000 owing to building improvement works/repairs and Project Management costs.

We're currently renewing our contracts with all our hall users and renters to help ensure the longer-term financial viability.
