The Parishes of Crathorne, Rudby in Cleveland with Middleton, Whorlton with Carlton and Faceby

All Saints Crathorne

Crathorne is a small village adjacent to the A19 with a population of approximately 100 living in either owner occupied housing or houses rented from the estate of Lord Crathorne. There is a small Post Office which opens on weekday mornings. All Saints' Church which has an open churchyard, a peal of 3 bells, is in a good



state of repair and is grade 2* listed having been extensively rebuilt in the 19th Century by Lord Crathorne's family.

Worship is based on Common Worship and there are 2 Holy Eucharists and 2 services of Morning prayer a month, 3 of the service are at 9.30am and one at 11am. The average attendance at Sunday services is 12 and in 2016 there were 6 Baptisms, 4 weddings and 2 funerals.

All Saints Rudby-in-Cleveland



Hutton Rudby is comprised of two sections, Rudby and Hutton with a population of approximately 2000 situated approximately 5 miles west of Stokesley. There is a SPAR convenience store with a Post Office and a Petrol filling station, a village hall, a Methodist Church in

the village. There is also a Primary School and the church lead "Open the Book" twice a month. Most of the population live in Owner Occupied houses although some live in Social housing and privately rented property.

All Saints Church is in a Covenant with the local Methodist and Roman Catholic Churches and some collaborative work is undertaken in addition to working together for Christian Aid etc.

All Saints Church, which is situated alongside the river which marks the boundary of Rudby and Hutton has a closed churchyard and a peal of 8 bells. The Church is approximately 700 years old, grade 1 listed and in a good state of repair. There is also a hall, known as Church House, in the centre of the village which is well used by the community and the Church.

There is a regular Sunday service in the Church and a well supported service on Tuesdays in Church House.

Worship is based on Common Worship and there are 4 Holy Eucharists and 1 Non-Eucharist services a month, mainly at 9.15am. The average attendance at Sunday services is 40, at Tuesdays 25 and in 2016 there were 15 Baptisms, 14 weddings and 17 funerals.

St Cuthbert, Middleton-on-Leven

Midddleton is a small hamlet between Hutton Rudby and Hilton, to the west of Stokesley with a population of less than 100 and a regular attendance of 9 at services which are held twice a month. All the houses are owner occupied by professionals or retired professionals.



The Church was built in 1799, does not have a burial ground and is grade 2 listed. Worship is based on Common Worship and there is one Holy Eucharist and Morning Prayer service a month, at 11am and 9.15am respectively. The average attendance at Sunday services is 9, and there were no Baptisms, Weddings or Funerals in 2016.

Holy Cross Church Swainby

The village of Swainby is in the ancient parish of Whorlton approximately 6 miles from Stokesley and 10 miles from Northallerton.



There are 2 churches, the medieval Holy Cross Old Church which is a ruin and grade 1 listed in the medieval village of Whorlton surrounded by the Churchyard and containing an effigy of a

knight and Victorian Holy Cross Swainby (the active building) which is grade 2 listed with a peal of 8 bells. There is also a chapel of ease, St Mary's Church Potto.

The village of Swainby has a population of 900 with two pubs and a cycle shop and cafe. There is a village hall and a church hall, both of which are well used and supported. Until 2017 there was a Church of England Aided Primary School in the village but it was forced to close when the roll dropped significantly. There is an hourly bus service to Stokesley and Northallerton.

Worship is based on Common Worship and there are 4 Holy Eucharist and one Morning Prayer service a month, in addition there is a cafe church held once a month. Service times are at 9.30am, 10.30am and 6pm. The average attendance at Sunday services is 32, and in 2016 there were 3 Baptisms, 6 weddings and 5 funerals.

St Mary's Church Potto

Potto is a small village which is in the parish of Whorlton, the church of St Mary's is a chapel of ease and has no churchyard. There is one service a month of Evening Prayer at 6pm and a Holy Eucharist at 10.30am on the fifth Sunday of the month, which is a benefice service.



St Botolph's Carlton-In-Cleveland

Carlton in Cleveland has a population of 250 with a pub and a Church of England Primary School which is confederated with the school at Chopgate.

The village is mainly owner occupied housing with professional or retired professional occupants.

The Church of St Botolph, grade 2 listed, was designed by the Victorian architect Temple Moore and has an open churchyard.

Worship is based on Common Worship and there are 3 Holy Eucharists a month, one of which is shared with the local Methodist Church. Service times are at



9.15am, 10.30am or 11am. The average attendance at Sunday services is 12, and in 2016 there was 1 Baptism, 2 weddings and 1 funeral.

St Mary Magdalene Faceby

The village of Faceby lies between Carlton in Cleveland and Swainby alongside the A172. The village has a population of 220 and a pub and village hall. Most residents live in owner occupied housing and are professionals or retired professionals.



The Church of St Mary Magdalene is grade 2 listed and has an open churchyard.

Worship is based on Common Worship and there are 2 Holy Eucharists at 9.15am and 10.30am and one Evening Prayer at 4pm a month. The average attendance at Sunday services is 11, and in 2016 there were 4 Baptisms, no weddings or funerals.
